

JULIA'S VINEYARD

2013 PINOT NOIR

WINERY DESCRIPTION

For most of Byron's 30 year history, it has been known for single vineyard expressions of Pinot Noir and Chardonnay. Today our focus remains on site specifc wines from Santa Barbara County's distinctive vineyard locations, in both Santa Maria Valley and Sta. Rita Hills.

WINE DESCRIPTION

Windy and arid, with some of the oldest vines in the region, our 2013 Julia's Vineyard Pinot Noir displays a complexity not often seen in Pinot Noir. The nose is driven by clear aromas of spice, led by cardamom, clove, vanilla bean, and black peppercorn, with undertones of black cherry and blackberry. The palate displays Bing cherry and cranberry, with more earthen elements of truffle and oak spice. Rich and textured, the finish trails away with a slight touch of smoke.
